

# NEW ENGLAND ASSOCIATION OF MATHEMATICS LEAGUES

The thirty-second annual New England Math Team Competition was held on May 2, 2004 at Canton High School, Canton, Massachusetts. Fifty Schools from all New England States competed for both team and individual awards. Schools were invited because they were the champion of their individual league or finished in the top three or four places in their respective State Tournament.

The NEAML competition is divided up into three divisions according to a school's enrollment in grades 10-12. The LARGE school division consisted of 19 schools whose enrollment is greater than 850 pupils; the MEDIUM division had 19 teams and enrollment is between 450 and 850; the SMALL school division had 12 teams and each school has less than 450 pupils. There are six individual rounds in the competition. The final round is a team round.
